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2 Your Hand Type

Water hand. You belong to the Water-hand type — a long palm with long fingers. You are sensitive, intuitive and emotional, with a rich inner life and strong creative and empathic gifts.

Core strengths: intuition, creativity, empathy, imagination and emotional depth.

Watch-points: over-sensitivity, moodiness, escapism and being easily overwhelmed.

Natural career inclination: the arts, music, healing, counselling, design, spirituality and caregiving.

In love: deeply romantic and devoted, you love intensely and need emotional security and gentleness.

3 The Life Line

It is the curved line that arcs around the base of the thumb, enclosing the Mount of Venus. It mirrors your physical constitution, stamina, zest for life and the broad rhythm of your years — emphatically not the length of your life.

Clarity in your photo — well-marked

Favourable

Yours reads strong and well-etched — a sign of robust vitality, quick recovery and an appetite for living fully. You carry physical and emotional reserves that carry you through demanding seasons, and you age with energy.

A line sweeping wide of the thumb shows an outgoing, adventurous, travel-loving nature; one hugging the thumb, a home-centred, careful temperament. Small lines rising from it mark bursts of effort and fresh starts.

A long, deep and clear Life Line indicates strong vitality, resilience and enthusiasm for life. A wide curve (sweeping toward the thumb) shows warmth and energy; a narrow one, caution. Breaks or chains can mark periods of change or low energy, not the length of life — which the line does not predict.

4 The Head Line

It runs across the middle of the palm and reveals how you think, learn, decide and concentrate — your intellect, mental style and the way you meet problems.

Clarity in your photo — deep and clear

Strong

Yours is clear and well-defined — a focused, capable mind that thinks things through, holds a thread of reasoning and can be relied on for sound judgement under pressure. You learn deliberately and remember what matters.

A straight line = logic, realism and a head for facts and figures; a curved, downward-sloping line = imagination, intuition and creative or artistic thinking. A long line shows breadth; a forked end ('writer's fork'), versatility.

A straight Head Line shows logical, practical and focused thinking; a curved one, creativity and imagination. A long line indicates depth and analysis; a short one, quick decisiveness. A line joined to the Life Line at the start suggests caution and family attachment in youth; a gap, independence and boldness.

5 The Heart Line

The uppermost of the great lines, it governs your emotional life — how you love, attach, express affection and handle the heart's joys and bruises.

Clarity in your photo — faint

Balanced

Yours is finer or chained in places, marking a sensitive, easily-moved heart that feels deeply but can be guarded. Choosing partners who are gentle and steady, and speaking your needs plainly, protects your peace.

Ending below the index finger = idealistic, devoted love; below the middle finger = a more independent, self-protective romantic style. A high curve shows passion openly expressed; a straight line, love shown through steadiness and deeds.

Curving up toward the fingers, the Heart Line shows a warm, expressive, demonstrative nature in love; running straight across, a more rational, steady and private approach to emotion. Ending under the index finger points to idealism in love; under the middle finger, a more self-directed romantic style.

6 The Fate Line

Rising up the centre of the palm toward the middle finger, it tracks career, direction, responsibility and the degree to which outside circumstances shape your path.

Clarity in your photo — well-marked

Favourable

Yours is well-marked — a clear sense of purpose, steady progress and the discipline to build something lasting. You are not easily blown off course, and your effort compounds over the years into real standing.

A line starting from the Life Line = success earned by personal effort; from the Mount of the Moon = a public-facing path helped by others' favour; breaks that restart higher = a welcome change of fortune or calling.

A strong, unbroken Fate Line shows a focused, steady career path and a clear sense of direction. Breaks and shifts indicate changes of career or circumstance — often for the better. A faint or absent Fate Line is common and points to a self-made, less conventional path rather than a fixed one.

7 The Sun Line

The Line of Apollo runs up toward the ring finger and speaks of talent, recognition, creativity, reputation and the warmth others feel for you.

Clarity in your photo — well-marked

Favourable

Yours is present and clear — a gift for being seen, appreciated and remembered, with real creative or expressive talent and a knack for attracting goodwill and opportunity at the right moments.

Several fine Sun lines show many interests and a sociable, artistic nature; a single deep one, focused mastery and fame in one field. It is strongest when the Mount of Apollo beneath the ring finger is also full.

Also called the Line of Apollo, a clear Sun Line promises recognition, creative talent, success and the goodwill of others. When strong it brings fame and artistic gifts; when faint or absent, success still comes but through quieter, steadier effort.

8 Your Head Line, Year by Year

Your head line is even, with stronger and lighter stretches, with 2 distinct changes along it.

Read from the index side across the palm.

Age	The line here	What this stretch indicates
0–12	Clear	a settled mind through these years; thinking is dependable without being intense
12–23	Faint · break	a marked change in the line here, traditionally read as a shift in outlook or direction of thought rather than anything befalling you
23–35	Fine · break	a marked change in the line here, traditionally read as a shift in outlook or direction of thought rather than anything befalling you
35–47	Fine	attention scatters more easily in this stretch; one thing at a time serves better than several
47–58	Faint · break	a marked change in the line here, traditionally read as a shift in outlook or direction of thought rather than anything befalling you
58–70	Faint	a period to protect your focus — fewer commitments, more sleep, and no large decision taken in a hurry

How to read this table honestly: the STRENGTH of the line at each point is measured from your photograph — where it runs deep, where it thins, where it breaks. The AGES are the traditional palmistry scale, which maps a position along the line onto a year of life. That scale is a convention of the art, followed here as it is usually taught; it is not something a camera can verify. Treat the spans as emphasis, not as dates.

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Your Fate Line — Chapters of Work and Direction

Your fate line runs fine and light for most of its length, with 4 distinct changes along it.

Read upward from the wrist toward the middle finger.

58–70	Faint · break	the line breaks here, the classic marker of a change of course — a change of work, of place, or of what you are working toward

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The Seven Mounts — Overview

The mounts are the fleshy pads of the palm, each named for a planet. A well-developed mount strengthens its qualities; a flat one shows that quality is more latent, waiting to be cultivated.

Mount	Development	Meaning
Mount of Jupiter	Well-developed	Well-developed — Ambition, leadership and confidence.
Mount of Saturn	Well-developed	Well-developed — Discipline, responsibility and wisdom.
Mount of Apollo (Sun)	Moderate	Moderate — Creativity, success and charisma.
Mount of Mercury	Flat	Flat — Communication, business and wit.
Mount of Venus	Flat	Flat — Love, passion and vitality.
Mount of Moon	Moderate	Moderate — Imagination, intuition and travel.
Mount of Mars	Moderate	Moderate — Courage, resilience and assertiveness.

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Mount of Jupiter · Well-developed

Below the index finger, this mount rules ambition, leadership, confidence and faith in oneself. Well-developed, it gives the urge to lead, teach and rise, with dignity and optimism; flat, a modest self-image to grow beyond.

Mount of Saturn · Well-developed

Below the middle finger, it governs discipline, responsibility, patience and wisdom. Balanced, it gives prudence, depth and staying power; very high, a serious, solitary streak; flat, a need to build steadiness and follow-through.

Mount of Apollo (Sun) · Moderate

Below the ring finger, the mount of the Sun rules creativity, success, charm and the love of beauty. Full, it brings artistic gift, brightness and recognition; flat, talent that flowers through deliberate cultivation.

Mount of Mercury · Flat

Below the little finger, it governs communication, business sense, wit and quickness. Developed, it gives eloquence, shrewdness and a flair for trade, science or healing; flat, a quieter voice to find confidence in.

Mount of Venus · Flat

The fleshy pad at the base of the thumb governs love, passion, vitality, warmth and the capacity for pleasure and family devotion. Full and firm, it gives charm, sensuality, generosity and a strong life-force; flat, a cooler, more reserved and self-contained nature.

Mount of Moon · Moderate

On the outer base of the palm, the lunar mount rules imagination, intuition, emotion and the love of travel and the sea. Full, it gives a poetic, psychic, wandering spirit; flat, a practical mind anchored in the here-and-now.

Mount of Mars · Moderate

The Martian zones (upper and lower) and the plain between them govern courage, resilience, temper and the capacity to stand your ground. Strong, they give grit and composure under fire; weak, a gentleness that benefits from assertiveness.

13 Fingers & Thumb

The fingers and thumb refine the reading. Their relative length, set and flexibility show how the energies of the mounts beneath them are expressed in your character.

Jupiter finger (index)	ambition, leadership and self-confidence — a long, strong index finger shows a natural leader; a short one, modesty or self-doubt to overcome.
Saturn finger (middle)	responsibility, discipline and balance — the longest finger, it governs your sense of duty, patience and seriousness of purpose.
Apollo finger (ring)	creativity, charm and the love of beauty — a long ring finger shows artistic flair, expressiveness and a flair for risk and recognition.
Mercury finger (little)	communication, wit and business sense — a long, straight little finger shows eloquence and shrewdness; a short one, shyness in self-expression.
Thumb	willpower and logic — a strong, well-set thumb shows determination and self-control; the upper section is willpower, the lower section reason. A flexible thumb shows adaptability, a stiff one, reliability and firmness.

14 Special Marks & Signs

Beyond the great lines, small marks add nuance wherever they fall. Look for these on your own palm — on a mount or across a line — and read them as colour added to that area of life.

Star	A bright star, especially on a mount or at the end of a line, marks a burst of success, recognition or a pivotal, fortunate event in that area of life.
Triangle	A clear triangle is a fortunate sign of skill, balance and good judgement — scientific or strategic talent, and luck that is earned through cleverness.
Square	A square is a mark of protection — it shields the area it touches, helping you weather difficulty and recover from setbacks without lasting harm.
Cross	A cross signals a challenge, a crossroads or a test in that domain; on the Jupiter mount, though, it can mark a happy, settled union.
Island	An island (a small loop in a line) shows a temporary dip — a spell of strain, scattered energy or divided attention — that passes as the line resumes.
Grille	A grille (criss-cross lines) over a mount shows that its energy is intense but scattered, asking to be focused and channelled rather than spent restlessly.



Your working life — vocation, ambition and the arc of your professional path — is read from the Fate line (direction and staying power), the Head line (how you think and decide) and the mounts of Saturn (discipline) and Jupiter (drive to lead).

Strength of this area

Strong

The signs point to a focused, rising career. You have the discipline to commit to a path and the judgement to steer it well, and your standing grows steadily over the years. Leadership, ownership or specialist mastery all suit you; the middle years especially reward bold, well-planned moves.

What your palm shows: Fate Line (well-marked), Head Line (deep & clear), Saturn (well-developed), Jupiter (well-developed)

To strengthen this: Strengthen this area by setting one clear professional goal a year, seeking a mentor, and finishing what you start — discipline is what deepens the Fate line.
